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B. PERSONAL LETTER (maximum 1 page)

Provide information on which department and research environment you would like to place your position as an Associate Senior Lecturer. Give the reasons for your choice. If you intend to use methods or techniques that are or will be available at MAX IV and /or ESS it should be stated here.

C. CURRICULUM VITAE (maximum 2 pages)

The CV should contain the following subheadings:

1. Contact information (address, telephone number, email)
2. Education (degree, subject, supervisor, university, title of thesis, year)
3. Employment (current at the top, include proportion of research, teaching, etc)
4. Leave of absence (including parental leave)
5. Postdoctoral stays (year, host institution, supervisor)
6. Awards and distinctions
7. Important assignments (commissions within the research community, year)
8. Research grants (name of PI, year, project name, funding agency, amount funded)
9. References (name and contact information)
10. Other relevant information of significance for the application

D. LIST OF PUBLICATIONS

Provide the following bibliometric information: total number of peer-reviewed original articles, total number of citations of the peer-reviewed original articles, used database, and date of retrieved information.

List the publications in chronological order (most recent first). The DOI code for each publication is to be provided where applicable. The applicant's name should be highlighted.

In the list, the following publications should be marked:

- The five most important publications (marked with *)
- The single most important publication after the PhD exam (marked with #)

The applicants own contribution to the marked publications should be stated (maximum 50 words). Motivate your selections (maximum 50 words).

E. RESEARCH PLAN (maximum 5 pages)

The research plan should contain the following information:

1. Purpose and aims
2. State-of-the-art
3. Scientific novelty
4. Planned research
5. Time plan, implementation and project organization
6. Equipment and need for infrastructure

7. International and national collaborations
8. References

F. TEACHING QUALIFICATIONS (maximum 2 pages)

The following information should be included:

1. Summary of teaching experiences

Provide information on your experience of teaching activities, production of teaching material, formal training in teaching, (co-) supervision of Bachelor and Master students, and PhD students.

2. Reflection on teaching activities

Briefly reflect on your experience of planning or performing teaching activities, as well as (co-) supervising Bachelor and Master students, and PhD students. Examples of questions to cover: What challenges have you experienced during teaching? What kind of teaching activities worked well and not so well? What actions did you take to improve your teaching?

G. LEADERSHIP AND INTERACTION WITH WIDER SOCIETY (maximum 1 page)

The following information should be included:

1. Summary of experiences in academic leadership and administrative activities.
2. Summary of activities associated with interactions with wider society and outreach activities.
